## INSTRUCTIONS FOR DISCUSSED POSTER PRESENTATIONS

### **Poster Session Information:**

A poster session is designed to permit the author to explain and illustrate his/her concepts, techniques or research findings in a manner that will promote understanding more readily than a podium presentation. Groups gather at various posters and rotate from one to the next with the authors discussing their findings in person.

In preparation for your poster for the session, we suggest that you limit the amount of text to the least possible giving preference to figures, illustrations and other descriptive materials presenting your work. Also, please prepare a 1 minute oral presentation of your work and consider making handouts of your poster for interested attendees. During the session please remain by your poster, present your work and discuss it with the attendees, but make sure that you do not engage in lengthy presentations so that everybody interested can learn about your work.

### **Presentation Set-Up Details:**

All poster presentations will be set up in exhibit hall, at least half an hour before the session. Our staff will be available to provide information on where your board will be located. Each poster has been assigned a number, which has been included in your acceptance e-mail. Posters will be placed on the boards by these numbers. You are responsible for mounting your poster on the board. Please do not remove your poster before the end of your session but do so promptly thereafter. The EUS will not be responsible for the posters.

### **Equipment Provided:**

The EUS will provide 4' high by 8' long tack boards mounted on a frame to hold two posters and pushpins.

### **Poster Format:**

The size of the poster should be 3' width by 4' height (or 91.5cm x 122 cm respectively). Please include your poster number at the left-top corner. The poster should be printed on paper, do not mount abstracts on heavy boards (these do not hang properly). A suggested format of the poster is presented [here](#).
